# Preparation

### 1. Know your Greek and Roman gods!

If you know them already - that is fantastic! If you are less sure about them there is a <u>colouring in book</u> you can download and enjoy while listening to the Odyssey (see 2). You can additionally read your sibling / someone else's child some of the many Greek Myth books for kids!

### 2. Listen to Homer's Odyssey (or read it).

You will find a recording of the Odyssey <a href="here">here</a> divided up by its chapters. If you have already read it - it will do you no harm at all to read it again. If you get really excited, see if you can listen to the <a href="lilad">lilad</a> as well. Although we won't be studying it, understanding it (or reading Stephen Fry's 'Troy',) will give you a massive boost!

### Read some historical novels or detective stories based in Ancient Greek or Rome.

For example:

Stephen Fry's Mythos, Heroes, etc.

Mary Renault's The Mask of Apollo

Margaret Atwood's The Penelopiad

Steven Saylor's Roma, etc.

Robert Harris's Cicero Trilogy

### 4. Watch Professor Michael Scott's documentary:

Ancient Greece The Greatest Show on Earth 1 - <u>Democrats</u> and 2 <u>Kings</u>. Make notes on the ideas.

## What will I need?

You will need a copy of Homer's <u>Odyssey</u> - the version we will be using will be Homer, 'Odyssey' translated by **E. V. Rieu**, revised translation by D. C. H. Rieu (Penguin). You can usually get hold of a second hand copy very cheaply. If you have any problem with this, please let me know. The school has funds that may be able to help.

You will need a lever arch folder for all your notes and booklets and I really recommend investing in a set of folder dividers.

You will need file paper or a good notebook for note-taking.
