

ver the Easter holidays 36 energetic students travelled across the Bay of Biscay to Barcelona for the school's second ever international sports tour.



The group enjoyed scorching weather conditions, a PortAventura Theme Park excursion, local Spanish football fixtures, inter school football and netball competitions and a day out in Barcelona and tour around the Barcelona Olympic stadium in scorching weather conditions.

Our travelling teams performed magnificently in their local fixtures with the U13 Football narrowly losing vs Montroig FC 3-4 and our U14 Football winning emphatically vs CF Cunnit 5-1. In addition, the Netball and Football teams represented the school to the highest levels in their end of trip Masterclass Tournaments with the U14 Netball coming 5th, U13 Football also coming 5th and U14 narrowly missing out on the big cup and coming 2nd on penalties.



The trip was another phenomenal success that upheld both the values and vision of the school. The PE department are

already planning the Sports Tour for Easter 2024 (hopefully including girls' football and boys' rugby to the travelling teams).

The final included a question time style Q&A with Charlotte being grilled by three Oxford Physics professors and she did brilliantly. She was knowledgeable, calm and confident and she did herself, and the school, proud. #### **TeenTech Finals**

fter Bishop Luffa entered the South East region *TeenTech* event in November, and ten of our students won Best Physical Innovation, we were strongly encouraged to enter teams for the *TeenTech* finals.

The Design and Technology department supported three groups in entering the finals, during lunch breaks and after school, fitting around other extra-curricular activities. Due to the hard work and dedication of our students one of the team entries has made the finals – Bella Wright (9Burrows) and Emmy Lamb (9Wilson) - Project 'Lock and Go Biometric Bike Lock'.

Over 300 schools registered for the *TeenTech* Awards and 14,000 students participated in the *TeenTech* Festivals and Innovation Live sessions which lead into the *TeenTech* Award programme. Over a thousand students completed projects and 68 teams will present to judges on the 28<sup>th</sup> June in London, Bishop Luffa being one of them.



The *TeenTech* Awards, established in 2012/2013, have become a prestigious event for schools, significantly contributing to students' understanding of how science and technology can be applied to solve real-world problems. This event encourages students to develop innovative ideas aimed at improving life, making it safer, simpler, or more enjoyable. Participation in the *TeenTech* Awards provides a structured approach and industry contacts, making it a powerful educational tool. To ensure students have the best possible experience, preparations are necessary before the big day on the 28th June.
