

## Year 12 Art Curriculum Map

Overview	The A level course begins with a six -week induction period; an introduction to media, processes and techniques in a series of teacher-led workshop sessions, in response to a given theme. Students are guided into conducting relevant contextual research and taken to London galleries to explore contemporary Art practice. Portfolio work becomes increasingly student-led with independence, originality and difference celebrated as essential qualities for success.
