

Year 8 Art Curriculum Map

Overview	As students move in to Year 8 we aim to consolidate their understanding of the visual elements through all three assessment criteria, whilst encouraging them to become thoughtful and perceptive practitioners. In Year 8 students are introduced to issue-based art and begin to explore and question some of the meanings and motivations behind powerful pieces of Art. Students will continue to develop their skills in observational drawing and drawing from the imagination. They will create a range of outcomes in both 2D and 3D.
