

## Year 12 Drama Curriculum Map

Overview	At A Level students further specialise in the subject, continuing the thread introduced at KS3 and developed at KS4 but now extending their theoretical knowledge and understanding of the subject and becoming more personalised, sophisticated and unique in their approach to performance. At this level students' work is divided into developing a comprehensive knowledge and understanding of Drama, evaluating live Theatre, discussing its relevance and purpose in today's society, the study of a play developing and demonstrating a sophisticated knowledge and understanding of the themes and style and how they are communicated through design and acting, the performance of script; both a monologue and a group performance communicating ideas powerfully on stage (designer route available), the creation of a sophisticated piece of devised drama responding to political and social ideas to use theatre as a vehicle for change (designer route available).
